
Dr. Skinner is married to the former Andrea Denise Bingham, a registered nurse by profession. They have three sons and three grandsons.

The Speaker



JOHNNIE WILLIAM SKINNER, SR., was born and reared in Harlem, New York City, to the late Reverend Alester J. Skinner and the late Georgia Skinner. He is a graduate of Nyack College, in Nyack, New York with the Bachelor of Arts Degree in philosophy. He received a Master of Divinity Degree from Union Theological Seminary in New York City. In May 1993, Reverend Skinner earned the Doctor of Ministry Degree from United Theological Seminary, Dayton, Ohio as a Samuel D. Proctor Fellow.

Dr. Skinner served as one of the pastors under the senior pastorate of Dr. Gardner C. Taylor at the Concord Baptist Church of Christ in Brooklyn, New York. Dr. Taylor had been Dr. Skinner's homiletics professor at Union Theological Seminary. On May 15, 1984, Dr. Skinner accepted the call to the Zion Baptist Church of Dayton, Ohio, the oldest Black Baptist Church in Dayton, Ohio. He served at Zion Baptist for seven years.

On February 15, 1991, Dr. Skinner accepted the call to the Mount Zion Baptist Church, Knoxville, Tennessee. He began his ministry at Mount Zion Baptist Church on June 2, 1991. A new spiritual tone and direction soon took hold of the Mount Zion Baptist Church Family. New ministries have been initiated at Mount Zion Baptist Church directed toward the future up building of God's reign and rule. Dr. Skinner bought with him to Mount Zion a new vision of ministry. It is a ministry directed toward meeting the needs of those who are suffering: it addresses the problems of racism, drugs and violence.

Scholarship Fund

The Knoxville District Baptist Missionary and Educational Association, out of a concern for encouraging the youth, created annual scholarships to be given to graduating seniors each year. The Association expanded the original scholarships given, and now we award eight (8) one thousand dollar (\$1,000) scholarships to high school graduates and three (3) five hundred dollar (\$500) to ministerial students enrolled in seminaries.

The scholarships are recommended by the Woods-Bailey-McAfee Scholarship Committee. The committee is named for the following:

Mrs. Frances "Fannie" Woods, wife of the late Rev. J. C. Woods. Mrs. Woods was a former President of the Women's Department of the Knoxville District and former President of the Tennessee Baptist Missionary and Educational Convention.

Rev. H. J. Bailey served for more than 45 years as Pastor of the Payne Avenue Baptist Church and a stalwart for educational support. Other places served were: Martha Davis Baptist Church and Nelson-Merry School in Jefferson City, Tennessee.

Rev. Edmond McAfee served churches in Kentucky and served as Pastor of True Light, Victory View, and Bethany Baptist Churches. He served for a number of years as Chairman of the Finance Commission of the District.


