

MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

ELDER JOE B. MADDOX, Moderator Knoxville District Baptist Association

Anthropocentric is a term that indicates a person or an organization is "man-centered." And, of course, Christocentric focuses on being "Christ-centered." My passion is to strive toward Christocentric. We, as Christians, are responsible for continuing the ministry that Jesus began while He was here on earth. Although I know we, as Baptist churches, are autonomous I wish to encourage us to get back to the basics—spreading the good news of Jesus Christ.



Spreading the good news, in my opinion, should not be left up to the pastors and preachers. It is incumbent upon us as pastors to equip the saints for the purpose of spreading the news. Our parishioners see thousands of lost souls each week, but we have not prepared them for the task of witnessing to them. With only 20% of the people in Knoxville and its metropolis being attached to any church, the harvest is certainly plentiful but we (I) have not been diligent to prepare the people where we (I) serve.

So, I challenge us to prepare the people to evangelize the lost. To this end I am grateful to Vice-Moderator Elder C. R. Battle and Congress President Dr. T. L. Mims for the curriculum they have put together for us. I trust that each of us will take full advantage of the information presented during this Session.

Further, I challenge pastors to UNITY. Why not share with each other as we are planning events that may benefit the whole. For instance, when one is planning a health fair I believe it to be a good show of unity if we were to invite neighboring churches to participate in the planning so that others may share in the ownership—thus engaging and reaching more people. As the leader of the Knoxville District Baptist Missionary and Educational Association, Inc., my desire is to pool our resources in an effort to be more effective and efficient at winning lost souls for Christ. Let us get busy "together" on our mission of The Great Commission. Missions involve two actions: Assisting and Evangelizing. I want to continue to bring this concept of missions to the forefront of the District.

As I have stated before, I believe that "missions" should not be an event or a day but is to be a way of life for gospel congregations. "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (Matthew 28:19-20, KJV).

COURSE SYNOPSIS AND INSTRUCTORS

The general theme for our Association is: "Seeing Through New Eyes: Refocusing on Missions." (Matthew 28:19). Our courses for this Session are centered on that theme as we seek to engage all aspects of "missions" which we believe involves two action words: aiding (helping) and evangelizing. Our definition of "missions" is a service that meets both the physical and spiritual needs of an individual. It is meeting people at their point of need with a view toward persuading them to look unto Jesus as Savior and Deliverer.

Class subjects, instructors, and class locations are as follows:

<u>The Ministry of the Brotherhood</u> – FACING THE GIANTS -- Pastor Richard Brown
This course is designed to help believers overcome their fears of facing lost souls. It is based on the movie and book by the same title. The book lists four basic giants in our lives that must be slain. The intent is to take these giants and apply them to the field of Evangelism and Missions. Those four giants are: Apathy, Fear, Defeatism, and Disappointment.

Teaching Teachers to Teach -- Dr. William Burwell

This course concentrates on the following: (A) So You Want to Teach; (B) How can I develop that passion? (C) My Teaching Strategy – Do I have one? AND € Courageous Interactive Teaching.

Out of the Stands and Into the Game -- Pastor Melvin Wright

This course seeks to jump start us in overcoming our fears of getting involved in reaching lost souls. (Based on Acts 4:1-22)

The Power of the Gospel to Motivate -- Pastor Thomas W. Dews

This course seeks to help us in understanding our need for motivation and to discover from the Word of God those principles that encourage us to overcome our fears.

COURSE SYNOPSES AND INSTRUCTORS (continued)

Music Ministry in a Missionary Baptist Church

Instructor(s): Bro. Aaron Staples and/or Minister Brandon Williams

This course seeks to give direction to the music ministry in finding ways to overcome our fear of Missions and Evangelism through Music. It seeks to accomplish this by examining the way we choose our music and the Theology of our chosen songs and Hymns. As we examine our songs according to Scripture, it should inspire even the members of our music ministry to become involved in God's purpose regarding Missions and Evangelism.

The Ministry of the Office Staff -- Sis. Robin Whitmore/Brenda Brabson

The purpose of this course is to assembly those who work in the Church Offices of our District. This would include Secretaries, Administrative Assistants, Office Administrators, Church Clerks, and other similar roles. The goal is to share together ways to improve our performance and encourage one another.

The Book of Acts -- Pastor Christopher Battle

The study of the book of Acts traces the setting aside of Israel and the kingdom message, and the establishing of the Church and the Gospel of Grace. This book shows us how the church grew through the witness of faithful and courageous believers — unafraid to reach out to lost souls - both in Jerusalem and in all Judaea and in Samaria and unto the uttermost part of the earth. It gives us the Message and Method of Evangelical Missions.

Scriptural Memorization -- Pastor Tommie L. Mims

This course will concentrate on the power of Scripture memorization to accomplish overcoming the fears to facing lost souls. It will center on the NEED for Scriptural memorization The POWER of Scriptural Memorization The ACT (or Practice) of Scriptural Memorization in which we will select specific Gospel Scriptures to Memorize. This is truly the Power of Evangelism.

<u>Pastors/Ministers Classes</u> – Pastor James M. McCarroll/Lecturer
